

Required

Family fee- \$550 (Only 1 per family, can be paid in installments.)

Band Camp Fee- \$200 (per student)

Competition Top Fee- \$75-100 (est.)

Group Supply Donation- Due at Band Camp. Varies by section, from list provided. Optional \$33 monetary donation in lieu of supply purchase to save you the shopping time.

Family, Band Camp, and Competition Top fees are paid through the school's fee collection procedures and are processed by the front office.

NYC Trip costs – appx. \$2,500 (optional)

- We **don't schedule** rehearsals and performances (the directors do that).
- We don't choose or plan trips.
- We don't communicate important information directly with students (section leaders, drum majors, and directors do that).
- We don't communicate report times, rehearsal times, etc., unless requested by the director (the director and student leadership are closer to the students and more timely and accurate).
- We don't receive funding from the band or LPSS or your band fees.




